COMMUNITY POLICING ...

Hello everybody. I have two crimes to report for Chideock for the past month. On June 30th a car was broken into at the Langdon Woods car park, with numerous items stolen from within the boot. On July 6th, a quantity of copper piping, within a bag, was stolen from the side of a property in Broadmead. If you have any information relating to this crime, please contact Dorset Police on 101, quoting occurrence number 55160101712.



We have though received a sharp increase in reports of scam telephone calls during the past few weeks. The latest untruth being peddled by the scammers is that they are acting on behalf of HM Revenue and Customs, and wish to speak to you about a fine, which will lead to court action against you. This is a scam, do not press 1 to connect to an advisor, do not pass any personal details whatsoever, and do not engage with the caller, simply hang up the phone. I am also still receiving the odd report of one of the older telephone scams, where the caller claims to be from Microsoft and needs to access your computer remotely for repairs. Please be aware of these scams, never part with personal information or bank details over the phone, and pass this information on to neighbours and family who may not be aware.

As the summer progresses, please may we issue a reminder about the manner of driving on our country lanes, bearing in mind that our roads will be seeing an increase in the numbers of drivers unfamiliar to the area. Please ensure that you only drive at a speed that allows you to stop in half of the distance of the road you can see, in case of oncoming traffic, and also stay tight in to the side of the road when negotiating bends, contrary to the standard on a major road.

Public Footpaths and Bridleways.

Keeping Public Footpaths and Bridleways clear is the responsibility of the land owner.

If you find a Public Footpath or Bridleway which is overgrown or ploughed up etc or a damaged gate / stile etc then please contact the Dorset Rights of Way Team. This can be done online (see below) or via Dorset Direct, giving the Footpath / Bridleway number and the location of the problem.

The Dorset Rights of Way team will then either ask the land owner to sort out the issue or will add it to their own list of tasks. However, do not expect the problem to be rectified immediately – both Dorset Rights of Way and landowners have many demands on their time and resources.

Don't worry about whether the problem has already been reported - better it is reported many times than not at all.

Please note that stiles are the responsibility of the landowner but the landowner does not have to make stiles suitable for dogs.

Dogs and Livestock.

Chideock is very fortunate in having a network of public footpaths over National Trust and privately owned land. **On public access land containing livestock, you must keep your dog on a short fixed lead (no more than 2 m in length).**

Chideock Parish Council (continued) ...

Dogs and livestock, (e.g. sheep and cows), do not go well together. People are often surprised to find that their friendly family dog chases farm animals.

If your dog chases or attacks livestock or looks as if it is going to, the landowner or farmer is entitled to shoot it.

When taking a dog through a field with livestock be aware that they may chase the dog, particularly if they have young. A cow with a calf can be more dangerous than a bull. Consider your safety and that of your dog.

Dorset is home to many important species of ground-nesting birds, such as nightjar and lapwing. Your dog may mean no harm to wildlife, but nesting birds see dogs as predators and may leave their young. While parents are away from nests the eggs get cold, hatchlings could die of exposure, and scavengers like crows may target the eggs and young birds. So please keep your dog on a short lead in this situation.

The Chideock Defibrillator Steering Committee are delighted to announce that our bid to the British Heart Foundation to supply the village with a defibrillator has been successful and that we are now the proud owners of a Zoll AED Plus defibrillator.

The British Heart Foundation required a contribution from the village of £400 and we are very grateful to Chideock WI for their donation of £400 to cover this. All we need now is somewhere to position the defibrillator and a cabinet, with suitable signs, to house it. We anticipate that this will cost a further £500 and we would be very grateful for any contributions that residents or local businesses feel able to make. With an ageing population in the village, large numbers of visitors in the summer and heavy traffic passing on the A35 this will be a welcome addition to facilities in the village. Of course we hope we don't have to use it but it is comforting to know it will be there.

“WIDENING THE CIRCLE OF BLESSING”

A few days ago I attended our annual Salisbury Diocese Clergy Day Conference, at Blandford Forum. These events offer the opportunity to learn in a little more depth about subjects of concern to us as ministers in the Church of England. This year we were privileged to listen to talks by Bishop Graham Tomlin, Principal of one of our Theological Training Colleges. He has written a number of critically acclaimed books – the most recent entitled “The Widening Circle – Priesthood as God’s way of blessing the world”. I want to explain its main message in the next couple of hundred words.

Graham begins by asking perhaps the most fundamental question that anyone can ask: “Why does the world exist, and why do we exist?” I wonder how you would respond to this question – it’s worth pausing for a moment to give this some serious thought! The answer that Graham gives, which he believes to be fully supported by the Bible, is that we exist for JOY!! In other words that we exist in order to experience happiness ourselves, bring joy to others, and pleasure to God! For example there is a great deal of joy in the Psalms: “Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad in all the good works of God!” We are invited to exist within a circle of growing joy and happiness, by sharing the joy with others! To enjoy life is to be for us a primary, rather than secondary purpose in life.

The next question posed by Bishop Graham is this: “How can we increase the sum total of joy?” He answers this with the idea of ‘Blessing’. We all have a role in blessing the created world, and in blessing other people – and in turn being blessed by all God’s creatures. We can do this by caring for others, and creating conditions where others (including all the environment) can flourish. The role of church ministers (or priests) is to encourage us to all play our part in doing this in an unselfish manner. So, I leave you with the challenge to widen the circle of blessing at every opportunity!
